Superior St. Additionally, the Gift of Deed indicates that the [Ryerson and Burnham Libraries of the Art Institute of Chicago](#) is committed to conserving the papers and making them available to the public (no appointments necessary and will be available during library hours). The museum has agreed to an incremental donation, meaning that the first twenty-nine years (1973-2002) of papers has gone to the museum and the gallery will keep the last five years of materials for reference with a new donation taking place every five years.
